

A Unique Opportunity: Study and Travel to Namibia, Southern Africa during the 2014 Presidential Election

President Emeritus/Distinguished Professor Irvin D. Reid invites you to join a unique foreign study opportunity in Namibia, Southern Africa. First, you will study Namibian democracy here on campus for 10 weeks. Then you will accompany Dr. Reid, and co-instructors Audley "Kano" Smith, Honorary Consul General of Namibia, and Darryl Shreve, Emmy winning Filmmaker, on a two-week field trip to Namibia in November to observe the presidential election. You will interact with students and ordinary citizens. The highlight of your field study will be the national elections where you will meet government officials and political candidates. You will also participate in the making of a documentary on democracy in Africa.

This course is for all majors and covers contemporary issues in Namibia, including HIV/AIDS and other health challenges, religious and traditional practices, political parties, sustainable economic development, civil societies as well as race and gender.

You will be based in Windhoek, the capital city but will also travel to rural areas for field research. You may even have an opportunity to go on a one-day safari, weather permitting. Schedule permitting, we may have a one-day sightseeing stopover in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Estimated Cost is \$3,975 - plus extras. Start looking for that summer job now! *Enrollment is by permission only.*
